North East Lincolnshire CSE action plan, statement of purpose

The purpose of this action plan is to ensure that all key partners, agencies and communities are aware of their individual role in ensuring that we keep improving the outcomes for children so that they thrive and are safe.

The action plan is a live document and is to be reviewed on a 6 monthly basis, scrutinised and authorised through the Keeping Children Safe Strategic Group and LSCB Operational Board.

The action plan will ensure that the indicator of reducing the level of risk of Child Sexual Exploitation is connected to the North East Lincolnshire Outcomes Framework and contributes to the whole population outcomes of ensuring

- All People in North East Lincolnshire Feel and are Safe.
- All people in North East Lincolnshire fulfil their potential through skills and learning.
- All people in North East enjoy good health and well-being.

CSE performance will be delivered on a quarterly basis through the Outcomes Based Accountability model detailing, how much we have done, how well we have done and more importantly the impact we are having within our communities and for our children of the borough.

Child sexual exploitation is a form of child sexual abuse. Sexual abuse may involve physical contact, including assault by penetration (for example, rape or oral sex) or non-penetrative acts such as masturbation, kissing, rubbing and touching outside clothing. It may include non-contact activities, such as involving children in the production of sexual images, forcing children to look at sexual images or watch sexual activities, encouraging children to behave in sexually inappropriate ways or grooming a child in preparation for abuse (including via the internet). The definition of child sexual exploitation is as follows (updated February 2017)

“Child sexual exploitation is a form of child sexual abuse. It occurs where an individual or group takes advantage of an imbalance of power to coerce, manipulate or deceive a child or young person under the age of 18 into sexual activity (a) in exchange for something the victim needs or wants, and/or (b) for the financial advantage or increased status of the perpetrator or facilitator. The victim may have been sexually exploited even if the sexual activity appears consensual. Child sexual exploitation does not always involve physical contact; it can also occur through the use of technology”

Child sexual exploitation is never the victim’s fault, even if there is some form of exchange: all children and young people under the age of 18 have a right to be safe and should be protected from harm.
